People's Summit brings together more than 200 political and social organizations in Brussels

July 17, 2023, Brussels, Belgium – The peoples of Latin America and the Caribbean and of Europe will meet today and tomorrow in Brussels, Belgium at the Peoples' Summit. This summit is being held in parallel to the III CELAC-EU Summit to serve as a space for debate, exchange, and discussion amongst the people about the most important issues for them and their communities.

More than a thousand people are expected to attend the Summit and delegations have arrived from Cuba, Brazil, Venezuela, Peru, Colombia, Honduras, Bolivia, Mexico, Haiti, Argentina, Puerto Rico, Ecuador, Chile, Belgium, Germany, Greece, Italy and Holland.

The People's Summit has taken on even more importance after the condemnation by CELAC countries, as well as social organizations, of the colonial and arrogant attitude of the EU, which has tried to impose its agenda, as well as its vision of cooperation, international relations, and democracy.

Rodrigo Suñe of the International Peoples' Assembly (IPA) and the Summit's organizing team, emphasized: “We understand that these spaces for dialogue have to take place from a perspective of mutual respect, reciprocity, complementarity, cooperation and solidarity, which historically has not been the case. Our summit will be this example of how we build balanced, fair relations, based on full respect for national sovereignty and the principle of self-determination of peoples.”

The People's Summit is organized by a broad coalition of more than 100 organizations, collectives, unions, political parties, and movements throughout the two regions, such as ALBA Movimientos, INTAL, CELAC Social, IPA, Jornada Continental for Democracy Against Neoliberalism, the Network of Intellectuals, Artists and Social Movements in Defense of Humanity (REDH), Party of the European Left, and others.

On Tuesday, July 18, the closing ceremony of the Peoples' Summit will be held at the European Parliament with the presence of Presidents Gustavo Petro, Miguel Díaz-Canel, Alberto Fernández and Luis Arce, as well as the Foreign Ministers of Mexico and Venezuela, Alicia Bárcena and Iván Gil.
